General Topics for the Business Meeting include the election of officers for 2012 and review of financial results through the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of 2011.

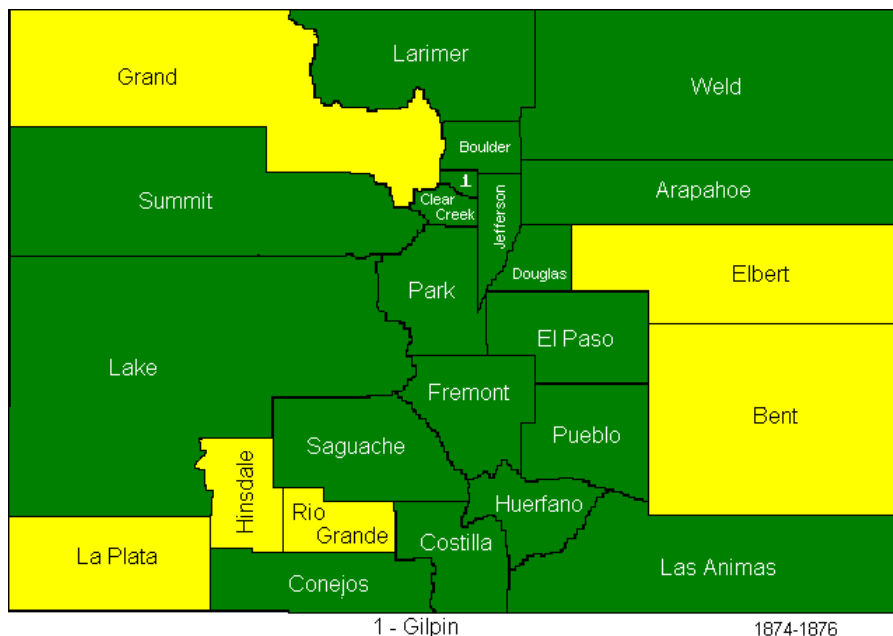
